TWO RECOMMENDATIONS:

Include **two** completed RCC Recommendation forms from *instructors, counselors, employers, etc.* in *sealed and signed* envelopes. Carefully select the individuals recommending you, as their assessment of your academic eligibility will be important to the selection committee. (*Only two recommendation forms will be accepted. If you submit more than two recommendations, extras will be discarded.*)

ONE COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES FORM:

Include a completed Activities Form with information about your school, community, family, and volunteer service. In addition to listing your community and volunteer activities, complete three of your most significant or favorite jobs. This section is very important to the selection committee selection process; use this form to demonstrate why you are their best choice. *List everything that applies, however, the committee recognizes that not all students will have numerous entries in every category; see the enclosed sample for ideas.*

ONE PAGE PERSONAL STATEMENT:

On a separate sheet of paper, include a statement of **ONE page or less** (no smaller than 10 pt. font) describing your educational and career goals, while indicating your planned major field of study. This section is also important in determining your eligibility. It is your opportunity to make a personal statement directly to the selection committee. **PLEASE LIMIT TO ONE PAGE.** *Essays exceeding the one page limit will not be evaluated.*

Your Personal Statement should include reference to some, or all, of the following:

- Life and Career goals
- Adversities you may have overcome
- Special qualifications
- Unique Family Circumstances
- Extra-curricular activities
- Honors & Awards received
- Organizations affiliated with & offices held
- What you are doing or will do to give back to your community
- Your main area of academic interest and why you chose it
- Your financial circumstances and how this scholarship will assist you

Your Personal Statement will be judged on content and persuasiveness, as well as spelling, grammar, and neatness. It is highly suggested that essays be in a typed format in Times New Roman font, no smaller than 10 pt.

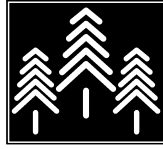
A complete application must include:

- a complete and signed application form. (*Incomplete forms are ineligible.*)
- two** completed Recommendation Forms in signed and sealed envelopes. *It is the responsibility of the student to make certain these recommendation forms are included in the application package when submitted.*
- a complete Community Activities Form.
- a Personal Statement, of **ONE page or less**, as described above.

SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION PROCESS

The Rogue Community College Foundation is a private, nonprofit corporation founded in November 1980. The foundation provides scholarships based on donations from individuals and groups, bequests to the foundation, as well as dollars raised through the foundation's fund-raising efforts. Usually the donor determines criteria for the scholarship, and occasionally the foundation determines the criteria. The amounts to be awarded are determined either by the size of the donation or based on the annual income from endowed funds.

After all applications have been received and grades have been entered for winter term, RCC transcripts are printed and enclosed with the applications. During the first weeks of April, applications are read and scored by foundation members and community volunteers selected by the foundation. Each application is read and scored by a minimum of two readers. Scores are based on family responsibilities, community activities and volunteer service, employment, goals, interests, financial need, recommendations, academic standing and the personal statement. Scores are averaged and tabulated. Awards are then made based on scores and specific criteria of individual scholarships. The process is completed during the first week of May with announcement of awards through letters sent to all applicants at their listed address.

Scholarship certificates will be presented at the Annual Rogue Community College Foundation Awards Ceremony on May 26, 2010. Funds will be applied to student accounts beginning Fall Term 2010 once the student registers for a minimum of 6 credits (unless otherwise specified by award). Awards of \$500 or less are awarded in fall term; awards of \$501 or larger are disbursed in thirds between fall, winter, and spring terms.

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
